



**BOROUGH OF FLORHAM PARK
ORDINANCE #15-14**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH
OF FLORHAM PARK IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY
TO AMEND CHAPTER 199, SIGNS, OF THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF FLORHAM PARK**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Florham Park, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1 – Section 199-34, Election Signs, of Chapter 199, Signs, of the Code of the Borough of Florham Park, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 199-34. Election Signs.

Election signs shall not be erected prior to forty (40) days before any election to which they pertain and shall be removed not more than five (5) days after the election. Such temporary signs shall not exceed sixteen (16) square feet in area in the B-1 Zone and such temporary signs shall not exceed four (4) square feet in any residential zone. Election signs shall not be erected on private property without the prior consent of the property owner. Such signs shall conform in all other respects to the requirements of this chapter.

SECTION 2 – All ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3 – If any article, section, subsection, paragraph, phrase or sentence of this ordinance is for any reason declared to be invalid, such declaration shall not affect the remainder of the ordinance.

SECTION 4 – This ordinance shall take effect upon final publication as provided for by law.
